Ideally, I believe parents should be obtaining their EFC figures as early as their child's freshmen year in high school. I would not recommend looking at any colleges without having some sense of what your EFC is before your search begins.

In some lessons, you will also find videos that I've recorded. In one video, for instance, I explain how to use a search tool at COLLEGEdata.com to look for schools that provide a high percentage of their students with merit awards, as well as schools that meet a high percentage of demonstrated financial need. I also recorded a video that explains how to use the financial statistics for individuals schools on the College Board website.

Also at the bottom of every lesson you will see a heading entitled, *Questions/Discussion* and below that a comment box. This is the section where you can ask me and other parents in the class questions and share your

observations.

I will be answering questions posted in the comment section for one entire month ending on Nov. 14.
